



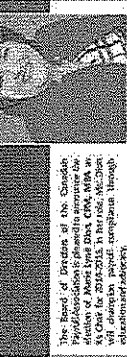

# U-boat, freighter found off N. Carolina

The wrecks of a German U-boat and a British freighter were found off the coast of North Carolina. The discovery of U-576 and Bluebird, the merchant ship sunk by the submarine, is the first of its kind since the end of the Second World War. The discovery was made by a team of divers from the US Navy. The U-boat was found at a depth of 1,000 metres and the freighter at 1,200 metres. The discovery is significant because it provides a rare opportunity to study the remains of a German U-boat and a British merchant ship from the Second World War.



The German U-576 circa 1940-1942. The submarine was sunk in 1942 after attacking and sinking the Bluebirds merchant ship. BY CAROLYN U-576 had already been hit and the submarine was making its way back to Europe when it came across the convoy. Despite being hit by eight depth charges, the U-boat managed to sink the freighter and damage two other ships. The submarine came under fire from the British warships and was sunk with all 45 crew on board perishing. None of those aboard the Bluebird died.

ALAN Knight might have got away with it for a while longer if not for his supermarket loyalty card.

A British fraudster who pretended to be quadriplegic and sometimes comes for two years to avoid prosecution has been caught on camera driving and strolling around supermarkets.

Alan Knight of Swansea, Wales, stole more than 40,000 pounds (£72,000) from the bank account of a charity helping the disabled.

When police began investigating the Knight, 47, claimed to be quadriplegic and so sick he sometimes fell into a coma. He checked himself into a hospital to avoid court appearances, saying he was having seizures.

The South Wales Evening Post reported Wednesday that the suspect, wife, Helen Knight, had written to the newspaper saying her husband had resumed a career.

Knight's deceit was uncovered when police tracked the use of his supermarket card, and produced surveillance camera footage of him walking and driving a car.

Faced with the video evidence, he pleaded guilty to 19 counts of forgery, fraud and theft. His wife has not been charged with any offence. Knight is due to be sentenced Nov. 7.

# Mormons open up about often ridiculed undergarments

SALT LAKE CITY The Mormon church is addressing the mystery of its sacred clothing by releasing a new video explaining the practice in-depth while admonishing ridicule from outsiders about what it considers a symbol of Latter-day faith.

The four-minute video on the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints' website compares the white, two-piece cotton "temple garments" to holy vestments worn by other religions, such as a Muslim kaftan.

The footage is part of a recent effort by the Salt Lake City-based religion to explain, expand or clarify its practices. The church's website posted the video in response to a question on the church's website in the past two years have addressed the faith's past ban on black men in the lay clergy; its early history of polygamy; and the millennium of the church's founding in 1820 on their own planet in the afterlife.

The latest video dispels the notion that Latter-day Saints believe temple garments have special protective powers, a trope once popular culture by the show "Futurama."

"These words are not only inaccurate but also offensive to many of our people," said Church President Russell M. Nelson in a video posted on the church's website.

The video comes two years after the church released a similar video about the undergarments in 2012, with the intent to damage his candidacy as the first Mormon presidential nominee of a major political party.

At one point during the ceremony, Nelson said, "I was told by a parent and my kids are amazing. I was told by a parent and my kids are amazing."

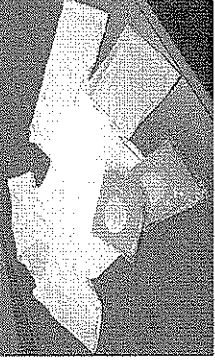

## Richard Henry Bain se défendra seul lors de son procès

**MONTREAL.** — N'avant plus d'avocat, Richard Henry Bain est résolu à se défendre lui-même. Son procès devrait commencer comme prévu en février, devant

un jury anglophone, et il compte bien appeler l'ex-première ministre Pauline Marois comme témoin. En ce qui concerne son aptitude à se présenter à son

procès, la question ne se pose même pas. «Ma santé n'est pas bien bonne, mais ma tête est super», a lancé M. Bain hier, alors que se dérou-

lait une conférence préparatoire en vue de son procès. Il s'agit d'un exercice visant à cerner les enjeux et à établir les paramètres d'un déroulement du procès.

M. Bain doit être jugé pour l'attentat au Métropolis qui a eu lieu le 4 septembre 2012, alors que le Parti québécois célébrait sa victoire électorale. L'homme de 64 ans est accusé d'avoir meurtre prémedité de Denis Blanchette, un technicien de scène, et de tentatives de meurtre, notamment à l'égard de Dave Courage, qui a été gravement blessé par balle. M. Bain fait face à d'autres chefs d'accusation ayant trait à l'incendie criminel qui a éclaté et la possession d'armes.

Hier, M. Bain s'est insurgé contre ces chefs concernant les armes, disant que dans les Laurentides, les gens ne rangent jamais leurs armes sous verrou, qu'ils visent les chevreuils de leur patio et que les policiers laissent faire. Ce n'est pas la même culture qu'à Montréal, a-t-il fait valoir.

Le procureur de la Couronne, Matthew Ferguson, prévoit que la présentation de sa preuve pourrait prendre de quatre à six semaines. Il a 48 témoins à présenter. La plupart témoigneraient en français. Il propose de prendre un jury bilingue, afin d'éviter les délais de traduction et accélérer le processus pendant le procès. Mais M. Bain n'était pas en tout d'accord. Il exige d'être jugé par un jury anglophone.


