
I, **Miriam Heinz**, of the City of Toronto in the Province of Ontario, MAKE OATH AND SAY AS FOLLOWS:


Regulatory Accountability web page. Attached hereto as **Exhibit "E"** is the link to, and screenshot of the web page that demonstrates this.



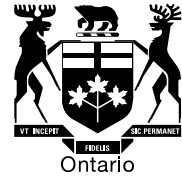

LETTER OF DIRECTION

The Ontario Energy Board (OEB) has now issued its Notice of Hearing for the IESO's application for approval of its 2018 expenditure, revenue requirement and fees (Notice). Please note that you must serve the Notice to the parties identified below **within fourteen days** of the date of this letter. If service is not possible within fourteen days, you must inform the Registrar immediately at Registrar@oeb.ca.

Further, you had requested that the IESO's draft Issues List be provided for comment along with the Notice. The OEB has decided that it will address matters related to an Issues List later in the proceeding.

You are directed:

1. To arrange immediately for the service of the enclosed English and French versions of the Notice, in the exact form accompanying this letter, except:
 - a. For the English version of the Notice, under the sections entitled "**BE INFORMED AND HAVE YOUR SAY**" and "**ORAL VS. WRITTEN HEARINGS**" remove the bold and bracketed words "[insert actual date 10 calendar days from the date the notice is posted on the applicant's website]"; and

- b. For the French version of the Notice, under the sections entitled “**SOYEZ RENSEIGNÉ ET DONNEZ VOTRE OPINION**” and “**AUDIENCES ÉCRITES OU ORALES**” remove the bold and bracketed words “[insérer la date, 10 jours suivant la date de publication sur le site Web du demandeur]”; and
 - c. In each of the English and the French version of the Notice, insert the same date which shall be determined by adding 10 calendar days to the date that each of the English and French versions of the Notice will be posted on the IESO’s website in accordance with the requirements of paragraph 3 below. If that date falls on a “holiday” as defined in Rule 6.02 of the OEB’s *Rules of Practice and Procedure*, insert the next date that is not a holiday. Use the following date format “**January 1, 2018**” for the English Notice and the following date format for the French Notice “**1 janvier 2018**”.
2. Once the the requirements of paragraph 1 are completed, to immediately and prior to completing any other steps required in this letter of direction, file with the OEB a pdf version of the complete Notice (Dated Notice).
3. To make a copy of both the English and French versions of the Dated Notice, the application and the evidence, and any amendments thereto, available for public review at the IESO’s office and on the IESO’s website at:

4. No later than the date, the Dated Notice is posted on the IESO’s website in accordance with paragraph 3 above, to email the Dated Notice to all interested parties who are registered to receive “IESO News” and other communiqués.
5. No later than the date, the Dated Notice is posted on the IESO’s website in accordance with paragraph 3 above, to serve a copy of each of the enclosed English and French versions of the Dated Notice and the application directly on all registered intervenors in OEB proceedings EB-2017-0150.
6. No later than the date, the Dated Notice is posted on the IESO’s website in accordance with paragraph 3 above, to serve a copy of each of the enclosed English and French versions of the Dated Notice and the application on all parties registered as IESO market participants (It is acceptable to e-mail the Dated Notice and the application to parties for whom the IESO has appropriate authorization to communicate via e-mail).

7. If the IESO has a twitter account, once both the English and French versions of the Notice are posted on the IESO's website in accordance with paragraph 3, to tweet the following messages:
 - a. "We have applied to the @OntEnergyBoard to increase our usage fees. Learn more. Have your say." The tweet is required to provide a live link to the English Notice posted on the IESO's website.
 - b. « Nous avons déposé une requête auprès de @OntEnergyBoard afin d'augmenter nos tarifs d'utilisation. Soyez mieux renseigné. Donnez votre opinion. » The tweet is required to provide a live link to the French Notice posted on the IESO's website.





ONTARIO ENERGY BOARD NOTICE

The IESO has applied for approval of its proposed 2018 revenue requirement, expenditures and fees.

Learn more. Have your say.

The Independent Electricity System Operator (IESO) has applied to the Ontario Energy Board for approval of its proposed revenue requirement, expenditures and fees to be charged effective January 1, 2018. The proposed revenue requirement, expenditures and fees are based on the IESO's 2018-2020 Business Plan that was approved by the Minister of Energy on March 19, 2018. The IESO is seeking the following approvals:

- a 2018 net revenue requirement of \$190.8 million, which includes a proposed capital expenditure envelope of \$26.6 million
- IESO usage fees of \$1.2402 per Megawatt hour (MWh) for domestic customers and of \$1.0115 per MWh for export customers commencing January 1, 2018, a 1.8% increase and 2.5% increase, respectively from the previous year's approved usage fees
- to calculate the usage fees using information provided to the IESO by electricity distributors on the amount of embedded generation in their service territory
- to rebate (or charge) to market participants the difference between the 2018 IESO usage fee approved by the Ontario Energy Board and the interim usage fee or fees paid
- to continue to retain \$6 million as an operating reserve, and to rebate \$1.4 million (amount in excess of the operating reserve) to market participants
- to continue to charge registration fees of up to \$10,000 per proposal for electricity supply and capacity procurements, including conservation and load management procurements
- to continue to charge a market participation application fee of \$1,000

THE ONTARIO ENERGY BOARD IS HOLDING A PUBLIC HEARING

The Ontario Energy Board (OEB) will hold a public hearing to consider the IESO's requests. We will consider the evidence filed by the IESO, question the IESO on its proposals, and allow interested individuals and groups that wish to participate to provide evidence, question the company and make arguments about whether the requests should be granted. At the end of this hearing, the OEB will determine if the IESO's proposed revenue requirement, expenditures and fees are appropriate and whether the approvals sought should be granted.

The OEB is an independent and impartial public agency. We make decisions that serve the public interest. Our goal is to promote a financially viable and efficient energy sector that provides you with reliable energy services at a reasonable cost.

BE INFORMED AND HAVE YOUR SAY

You have the right to information regarding this application and to be involved in the process.

- You can review the IESO's application on the OEB's website now.
- You can file a letter with your comments, which will be considered during the hearing.
- You can become an active participant (called an intervenor). Apply by **June 18, 2018** or the hearing will go ahead without you and you will not receive any further notice of the proceeding.
- At the end of the process, you can review the OEB's decision and its reasons on our website.





2018 Revenue Requirement Submission

The IESO filed its 2018 Revenue Requirement Submission (RRS) with the Ontario Energy Board (OEB) on April 30, 2018. The submission and other documents which form the record of the OEB's proceeding are available on the [OEB's website](#) (Case Number EB-2018-0143).

The IESO's expenditures, revenue requirements and fees allow it to carry out its broad mandate and deliver on additional initiatives. Even with its additional initiatives, the IESO intends to hold its revenue requirement for 2018 at 2017 approved budget levels. In its application, the IESO is seeking approval for its proposed revenue requirement for 2018 at 2017 approved budget levels of \$190.8 million, a domestic usage fee of \$1.2402/MWh, and an export usage fee of \$1.0115/MWh.

Market and System Operations

Baseline 39.1 now published

Baseline 39.1 has now been published. The baseline is a formal process to revise market manuals and related documents that result from recently approved market rule amendments or technical system changes.

The changes in this baseline were communicated through the plan and review process, and feature an amendment to the market rules, as well as revisions to market manuals and supporting documents. These are available on the [Market Rules and Manuals Library](#) and [Technical Interfaces](#) web pages, respectively.

Transmission Rights Clearing Account Disbursement

Participants withdrawing energy from the IESO-administered market will see a payment from the Transmission Rights Clearing Account disbursement on the May 31 preliminary settlement statement and May 2018 invoice, both to be issued on June 14. Funds from the clearing account will be credited using charge type 102 'TR Clearing Account Credit.'

The total amount of this disbursement will be \$100,407,651.79. Market participants will receive their pro-rata share of the total amount based on the total allocated quantity of energy withdrawn (AQEW) for consumers, or the scheduled quantity of energy withdrawn (SQEW) for exporters, over the last six months (December 2017 – May 2018).

Through the [transmission rights market](#) in Ontario, the IESO sells transmission rights

through an auction process entitling the owner to a payment if the price of energy in Ontario is different from the price in an intertie zone. The Transmission Rights Clearing Account has a threshold set by the IESO Board of Directors and surplus amounts in the account are disbursed over time.





The IESO filed its 2018 Revenue Requirement Submission (RRS) with the Ontario Energy Board (OEB) on April 30, 2018. The submission and other documents which form the record of the OEB's proceeding are available on the [OEB's website](#) (Case Number EB-2018-0143).

The IESO's expenditures, revenue requirements and fees allow it to carry out its broad mandate and deliver on additional initiatives. Even with its additional initiatives, the IESO intends to hold its revenue requirement for 2018 at 2017 approved budget levels. In its application, the IESO is seeking approval for its proposed revenue requirement for 2018 of \$190.8 million, a domestic usage fee of \$1.2402/MWh, and an export usage fee of \$1.0115/MWh.
