Re: Request for Amendment to OEB Decision EB-2024-0223/EB-2024-0224 for Inclusion of Chatham by Lakeshore Limited Partnership (CLLP)

Hydro One Networks Inc. (Hydro One) is withdrawing its earlier request (dated October 30, 2024) to the Ontario Energy Board (OEB) to amend Decision EB-2024-0223/EB-2024-0224 to include the Chatham by Lakeshore Limited Partnership (CLLP). Instead, Hydro One is requesting a temporary exemption from the requirements outlined in Section 6.1.3 of the Transmission System Code (TSC) on behalf of CLLP.

This exemption would remain in place until Hydro One submits updated Transmission Connection Procedures (TCP). The updated TCP will establish a common connection procedures for CLLP as an affiliate of Hydro One. Hydro One plans to file these updates with the OEB in early 2025, after the completion of the OEB's ongoing consultation to review connection rules and procedures within the TSC.

CLLP was issued a transmission license from the OEB on July 25, 2024, for the purpose of owning and operating a 230kV double-circuit transmission line comprised of circuits C87H and C88H. Like B2M LP and NRLP, which are single asset ownership entities, CLLP has not published an OEB-approved Transmission Connection Procedures (TCP) for processing requests to connect to its transmission system, as required by Section 6.1.3 of the TSC. As communicated to the OEB, Hydro One intends to file an updated TCP with the OEB following the conclusion of the Transmission Connections Review proceeding, which will apply to all its partnership affiliates including CLLP. Hydro One is therefore seeking a temporary exemption from Section 6.1.3 of the TSC for CLLP until Hydro One files its updated Transmission Connection Procedures (TCP) with the OEB for approval or July 1, 2025, whichever comes earlier.

CLLP has not received any requests from prospective customers seeking to connect to its facilities and there is no reasonable expectation that a prospective customer would request a connection to these facilities at this time. In the event CLLP receives a request for connection in the immediate or near future, CLLP shall process requests for connection and deal with other related matters in accordance with all applicable provisions of the TSC and otherwise in a manner that is reasonable and consistent with the TSC, the OEB Act, the Electricity Act, 1998 (Electricity Act) and their electricity transmission licences.



Hydro One requests that an interim exemption be granted until the OEB issues its decision regarding this matter. Hydro One requests that a proceeding be conducted by way of a written hearing, if necessary.
