Re: Total Cost Benchmarking Update Invitation to Participate OEB File Number: EB-2025-0102

The Ontario Energy Board (OEB) is initiating a consultation to engage interested stakeholders in a review of the use of Total Cost Benchmarking (TCB), including Total Factor Productivity (TFP), in the assessment of overall cost performance of rate regulated electricity distributors. This consultation is aimed at renewing the 2013 benchmarking methodology which is expected to incent distributors towards enhanced productivity. The OEB intends to collect stakeholder input on recommended changes and improvements to support the continued development of the OEB's TCB methodology and data, and the proposal to repurpose the use of TFP as a productivity measure in the "X-factor" calculation. Stakeholder feedback will also inform the OEB in its consideration of developing and using a Global Stretch Factor (GSF) as a new Ontario industry-wide productivity expectation for electricity distributors.

Background

Total Cost Benchmarking is part of Performance based regulation (PBR) which is used by the OEB to approximate a competitive marketplace¹. As part of the performance based approach referenced in the Report of the Board², "distribution rates are set on a forward test-year cost of service basis and subsequently indexed by a price cap index formula which is used to adjust the distribution rates to reflect expected growth in the distributors' input prices (the **inflation factor**) less allowance for appropriate rates of productivity and efficiency gains (the **X-factor**)." During the rate term that follows a cost of service year, distributors may apply for mechanistic rate adjustments based on the inflation minus X-factor formula.

The X-factor is the sum of a productivity factor (X) and a stretch factor (SF). Subtracting the X-factor from inflation (I) ensures that rates decline in real, constantdollar terms, providing distributors with a tangible incentive to improve efficiency or else experience declining net income.

The productivity component of the X-factor is based on TFP, which has been set at 0% since its introduction in 2013 as a measure of the Ontario industry-wide productivity value. The SF component of the X-factor is a measure of a distributor's total cost performance as benchmarked against other distributors in Ontario. TCB, which is used to set the expected benchmarks for distributors, has also not been updated since 2013. The OEB will review and update the existing TCB methodology by including new data collected over the past decade.

The OEB proposes to update the X-factor by changing the components of X. The SF will continue to be used as a component of X to set a local market productivity expectation. Moving forward, repurposing the TFP component to assess industry performance and PBR effectiveness and the introduction of GSF will be considered.

The OEB has retained Pacific Economics Group Research, LLC (PEG) to support the TCB update and contribute to the associated consultation work. Working under the oversight of OEB staff, PEG will soon begin to engage with stakeholders for review and feedback.

Consultation Format

This consultation will involve three phases.

Phase 1 - Stakeholder Meeting Kickoff

• The consultation will begin with a virtual stakeholder meeting on **April 24, 2025**, from **9:30 a.m.** to **12:30 p.m.** During the session, PEG will deliver a presentation on the existing TCB framework and proposed improvements in the upcoming update.

Phase 2 - Surveys and Comments

• Surveys will be distributed to stakeholders who will have until **May 15, 2025**, to share their responses along with any additional written comments. Reponses will be kept anonymous and used to guide the OEB in making future enhancements to the TCB methodology.

Phase 3 – Draft Report of the OEB:

 It is expected that an initial draft of a Report of the OEB, that details the proposed changes to the TCB framework and outlines stakeholder feedback will be circulated to stakeholders by **June 15, 2025** for their review and further written feedback by **July 15, 2025**.

Invitation to Participate

Stakeholders wanting to participate in the consultation are asked to email notice of their intention to <u>registrar@oeb.ca</u> by **April 8, 2025**, with "EB-2025-0102 Total Cost Benchmarking Update" in the subject line. Letters should include:

- Full Name of organization/participant,
- Name(s) of attendees to register,
- A contact name, telephone number and email address, and
- A statement as to whether the participant is requesting cost eligibility.

PEG will reach out directly to registered participants with details on survey distribution.

Cost Award Matters

Cost awards will be available to eligible participants under section 30 of the *Ontario Energy Board Act, 1998* for participation in the consultation. Participants intending to request an award of costs must file a written submission to that effect by **April 8, 2025**. Costs awarded will be recovered from all licensed rate-regulated electricity distributors. Further information regarding cost awards is included in Appendix A to this letter. Appendix A: Cost Award Matters

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Cost Award Eligibility

The OEB will determine eligibility for costs in accordance with guidelines outlined in the <u>Practice Direction on Cost Awards</u>. Anyone seeking to request an award of costs must submit a written request to the OEB by **April 8, 2025**.

The submission must outline the reasons why the person believes they qualify for a cost award, addressing the OEB criteria for cost eligibility as specified in section 3 of the <u>Practice Direction on Cost Awards</u>. Additionally, the submission must include an explanation of any other available funding sources accessible to the person.

Furthermore, it should include the name and qualifications of any lawyer, analyst or consultant the person intends to retain, if known.

All requests for eligibility for cost awards will be published on the OEB's <u>website</u>. As stated above, costs for all stages of the consultation will be recovered from rate-regulated electricity distributors, therefore if a rate-regulated electricity distributor objects to any of the requests for cost eligibility, those objections must be submitted to the OEB by **April 11, 2025**. Any objections will be posted on the OEB's website. The party whose cost eligibility was objected to will have until **April 15, 2025**, to file with the OEB a reply submission as to why its cost eligibility should be approved.

The OEB will subsequently make a final determination regarding the eligibility for costs of the participants who have made requests.

Eligible Activities

The activities eligible for cost awards are:

Cost Award Amounts

Further information regarding any subsequent consultation activities eligible for cost awards will be communicated later.

When calculating the amount of the cost awards, the OEB will adhere to the principles outlined in section 5 of its <u>Practice Direction on Cost Awards</u>. The maximum hourly rates set out in the Cost Awards Tariff will also be applied. The OEB expects that groups representing the same interests or class of persons will make every reasonable effort to communicate and co-ordinate their participation in this process. As per section 12 of its <u>Practice Direction on Cost Awards</u>, the OEB will serve as the central entity for all disbursements of cost awards in this process.
